#### To the faithful at St. Stephen's Beaumont,

It has been a joy worshipping with you the last two Sundays (August 27 and September 3), and I know everyone will be excited when Reverend Stacey returns this Sunday (September 10). I am reaching out to make sure you are informed about where we are going into Fall.

First, at our August 29 meeting, the Bishop's Committee accepted the 2022 Audit and approved a **preliminary 2024 budget** calling for expenditures of \$120,464. This budget would meet all anticipated expenses and be funded by the faithful giving of our members with no diocesan support (Mission Development Grant) for the second consecutive year. The budget also assumes that my 2024 compensation would be paid by Trinity Parish where I continue to serve as priest in charge in addition to being your vicar.

It is my hope that you will prayerfully respond to our annual financial appeal on or before Sunday, October 29, when **Bishop Frank Brookhart returns to St. Stephen's** to preside, preach, receive new members, and consecrate our Pet Memorial Garden. You will find a 2024 pledge card in this newsletter and additional copies are available at the church.

Second, we have been talking a lot about various educational offerings lately, some of which are in house, while others are being offered at the diocesan level. Here at St. Stephen's, **Scott Hamre** will be leading a study of **Galatians** on Zoom beginning Tuesday, September 12 at 6:45 pm. Email Scott at <u>norseman0802@gmail.com</u> or see him at Sunday worship to receive the class link. In addition, Reverend Stacey and I will soon meet to schedule training for those wishing to serve as Lay Eucharistic Ministers (during Sunday worship) and Lay Eucharistic Visitors (outside Sunday worship). We also will train Lectors and Intercessors.

At the diocesan level, **Sharon Miller** will be leading a group that will attend the **Climate** Change Summit on Saturday, Sept. 16, at St. Paul's Commons. Email Sharon at <u>foodvalue1@gmail.com</u> or see her at Sunday worship for more information. We also are encouraging people to attend the four-session online "Episcopal Identity" course offered by Bloy House on Wednesdays from 7:00 to 8:30 pm, beginning October 25. While there are other worthwhile Bloy House offerings that may be of interest, the "Episcopal Identity" course is required or recommended for all licensed lay ministries. I have even registered for and will attend the class so that I can learn what the best and brightest are saying about The Episcopal Church. As the Bloy House folks put it, "A deeper dive than a confirmation class, even cradle Episcopalians will learn something new about our church."
